Maths	<p>Page 122</p> <p>Own measuring activity: 1. Gather different containers at home. 2. Fill a bucket or saucepan with water. 3. Have fun measuring how much liquid each container holds.</p>	<p>Game: Go Fish!</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Each player gets 7 cards and the rest go in the 'pond' in the centre. Remove the pairs and take turns trying to find a match for the rest of your cards. Ask the person on your left 'Do you have a ____?'. If they do they must give it to you, if not they say 'Go Fish!' and you take a card from the pond.
