PARENT TEACHER MEETINGS

Parent Teacher Meetings take place next week at the school. Please book a meeting with your child's class teacher via the 'Aladdin Connect' App.

Free-of-charge minding service (for the duration of your meetings only) is available in the school library or PE Hall from 2.30pm–4.00pm on Monday 4th, Tuesday 5th, Wednesday 6th and Thursday 7th, (the busiest afternoons.)

(Some junior & senior infant meetings are scheduled to take place between 1.30pm and 2.30pm: infants can be dropped to our 'after-school supervision group' for the duration of their parents' meeting with the teacher.)

Outside of these supervision times, the children should stay in or near the classroom during their parents' meeting — they remain under the care of their parents or guardians during these times.

Pupils: No unsupervised wandering around the school (activity room, multi-sensory room, playgrounds, etc.)

CLASSES FINISH EARLY TOMORROW

Wednesday 29th November: Classes finish at 12noon (infants) and 12.30pm (older classes.) Primary language curriculum training for staff. (Infants with older siblings and infants who use the school buses will be supervised until 12.30pm.)

Medicines in School - General Guidance:

Non-emergency medication during the school day: parents need to come to the school to administer that medicine. Children are not permitted to carry painkillers, antibiotics, etc. to school.

Emergency medication during the school day: parents need to provide the following to the school — (1) Letter of Authorisation (including clear instructions for school staff.) (2) Signed legal form, ("Legal Indemnity.") (3) The Anapen or other Medicine, (to be placed in locked medicine cabinet.)

Inhalers: Same as 'emergency medication' above, except that the inhaler will be stored in a readily accessible place in the child's classroom. [Older children can store inhalers in their school bags: parents should state this in their Letter of Authorisation/Instruction to the school.]
